Tomorrow is Valentine's Day, a day for sweethearts, couples or good friends. Children, especially, will pass around small heart-shaped sugar candies to their classmates. These tiny sweets all have a short message stamped on them: "Be Mine," "Kiss Me," "Call Me," "Let's Get Busy" or "Miss You." Every year, about 8 billion candy hearts are made for consumption, or about 100,000 pounds per day!

Although these colored candies have been around for more than 100 years, the messages had not changed much — until about 30 years ago.

Since the 1990s, new sayings have been introduced that are more appealing to contemporary kids. There was "Fax Me," "Call Me" and "Email Me." Today, there's even one that simply says "LOL." That means, "Laugh Out Loud." The company who makes Sweethearts gets hundreds of suggestions each year.

If you were asked for a text idea, how would you respond?

How about a Bible verse that mentions love?

- John 3:16 ("For God so loved the world ...")
- 1 John 4:8 ("God is love.")
